

Resolutions—Ordinances—Proclamations

Motion to approve Resolution 2013-24 Regarding a Joint Land Use Study Pertaining to Roosevelt and Curry Counties for the Purpose of Coordinating Efforts between Municipalities, Land Owners, Cannon Air Force Base and Melrose Air Force Base Range was made by Commissioner Buzard with a second by Commissioner Burton. 5 yes votes. Charles Bennett, a community member and a member of the JLUUS committee gave a report on JLUUS activities and research. JLUUS is an acronym for Joint Land Use Study. Mr. Bennett stated that the studies done by the Economic Development Office was slanted to the military because that is who pays them. He felt the studies done for Roosevelt and Curry counties were just a test run for JLUUS studies nationwide. This book is a scary document that covers many agendas that the military wants to have final authority to check off any project and shift responsibilities and costs to the local governments to implement military objectives. One example was control of lights at public places such as arenas and ball parks. He stated that the study contained dangerous and unclear parameters. County Manager Webb agreed with Mr. Bennett and expressed concerns with rules being forced upon the local governments. County Attorney Queener agreed also. The resolution is stating that the Commission accepted the JLUUS 2011 only so the study costs could be paid. Roosevelt County does not agree with all of the findings, statements, assumptions and presumptions contained within the JLUUS 2011.

Executive Session

The Motion was made to go into Executive Session at 11:18 a.m. for the purpose of Threatened or Pending Litigation was made by Commissioner Burton with a second by Commissioner Leal. 5 yes votes. Motion to come out of Executive Session at 12:03 p.m. was made by Commissioner Burton with a second by Commissioner Buzard. 5 yes votes. No Action taken.



The Roosevelt County Commission met in a special business meeting Tuesday, August 13, 2013, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioner's Room in the Courthouse with those present being: Commissioners Scott Burton; Bill Cathey; Kendall Buzard; Richard Leal; and Jake Lopez; County Manager Charlene Webb; Administrative Assistant Jena Wilbanks; County Attorney Rick Queener, Road Superintendent Ricky Lovato; Assistant Road Superintendent Juan Dominguez; Jeff Brown and Dee O. Brown.
Commissioner Cathey called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Rick Queener gave an Invocation and Commissioner Cathey led the Pledge of Allegiance and the Salute to the Flag of the State of New Mexico.

Motion to Approve the Agenda was made by Commissioner Leal with a second by Commissioner Buzard. 5 yes votes.

Travel to S. Roosevelt Road A
Attorney Queener stated a motion was not necessary to travel to South Roosevelt Road A. The best method and direction to travel the road was briefly discussed and arrangements were made to travel through Arch on NM 88 and travel the road north to NM 202.

Commissioner Burton acknowledged Jeff and Dee Brown in the audience. The Browns indicated they were present to understand what the process was for viewing and closing a county road. They indicated they were interested in closing a portion of N. Roosevelt Road 1 and A that accessed their property only. Mr. Queener explained they would need to be placed on the agenda.

At this time, the Commission disbursed into trucks and traveled to South Roosevelt Road A.

View S. Roosevelt Road A between NM 202 and NM 88 to Determine Condition and Any Further Action Necessary.

The County Commission, Attorney Queener, County Manager Charlene Webb, Executive Assistant Jena Wilbanks, Road Superintendent Ricky Lovato and Assistant Road Superintendent Juan Dominguez traveled the nine miles of South Roosevelt Road A. The group made two stops to view areas that are steep and to take a closer look at the location of the fences located on either side of the roadway. Superintendent Lovato expressed his concerns that there was not any room to widen the roadway as proposed by Matt and Elizabeth Belcher.
The commission returned to the Roosevelt County Courthouse at 10:48 a.m.
