

Declaring September 2022 as Suicide Prevention Month in Roosevelt County

WHEREAS, September is known globally as "Suicide Prevention Month", the National Suicide Prevention + Action Month Proclamation was created to raise the visibility of the mental health resources and suicide prevention services available in our community. The goal is to start the conversation about mental health and the impact of suicide to help destigmatize the conversation and help connect people with the appropriate support services; and

WHEREAS, according to the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (A.F.S.P.), Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death among adults, and the 2nd leading cause of death among individuals between the ages of 10 and 34 in the US; and

WHEREAS, more than 48,000 people died by suicide across the United States in each year, with an average of 132 suicides completed daily; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico ranks fourth in the nation for age-adjusted suicide rates and New Mexico's suicide rate was 79 percent higher than the U.S. rate; and

WHEREAS, in New Mexico, suicide is the second leading cause of death for ages thirty-four and younger; the fourth leading cause of death for ages thirty-five to forty-four; the ninth leading cause of death for ages fifty-five to sixty-four; the fourteenth leading cause of death for ages sixty-five and older; and is the tenth leading cause of death in the state overall; and

WHEREAS, each and every suicide directly impacts a minimum of 100 additional people, including family, friends, co-workers, neighbors, and community members; and

WHEREAS, the Roosevelt County Board of Commission publicly places its full support behind those who work in the fields of mental health, education, and law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, we encourage all residents to take the time to understand the importance of mental health education and recognize that taking care of ourselves and others includes taking care of mental health; and

WHEREAS; it is essential to share the message that it is always okay to ask for help and that individuals struggling with thoughts of suicide or self-harm should be encouraged and assisted in reaching out for help; and, in New Mexico the following are phone numbers to reach out for help: Dialing 988 for behavioral or mental health crises; the New Mexico Crisis and Access Line at 1-855-662-7474; and the Agora Crisis Line at 505-277-3013 or 855-505-4505.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Roosevelt County Board of Commission do hereby proclaim the month of September 2022, as
